For Discussion: Draft Criteria for Ranking Tier I Projects

When we started re-evaluating the list of NATA projects back in late 2013/early 2014, the underlying premise was to measure success this way:

"SUCCESS = MOVING THE NEXT REASONABLE PHASE OF A PROJECT FORWARD."

Here is how we defined the Tiers for the February 2014 NATA board discussion:

- **Tier I Projects** = regionally significant projects NATA taking lead to actively support.
- <u>Tier II Projects</u> = includes studies and projects with smaller areas of influence, where we support/monitor, but where NATA members take lead.
- <u>Tier III Projects</u> = Project in the queue (horizon projects).

This becomes important as we try and determine how to 'bridge the gap' for funding.
Ability to leverage local/state/regional/federal funding.
